PURPOSE

Provide outlet for youth at risk for gang involvement, violent acts, gun possession, recidivism, etc. to interact with positive role models and learn positive youth development skills (conflict resolution, healthy decisions, etc).

Increase youth awareness of factors that lead to violence, improve trauma coping skills while providing mental health awareness needed to recognize and respond to violent encounters

Introduce youth to independent social emotional learning and ongoing adjunct online, peer to peer resources to prevent violence with an evidence-based program called Students Against Violence Everywhere (Sandy Hook Promise)

Provide opportunity for youth to interact and build relationships w/ law enforcement

Learn Skills that could save a life such as Stop the Bleed and Hands Only CPR. Parents learn the Importance of Safe Storage of Firearms (BE SAFE)!

THERE ARE SEVERAL SECURE GUN STORAGE DEVICES YOU CAN USE TO PROTECT YOURSELF, FRIENDS AND FAMILY:

A CABLE LOCK - Often provided with the purchase of a weapon, this option prevents gun use by small children.

GUN SAFE - Provides storage of more than one firearm, including guns, and is equipped with a biometric lock, which is more secure than a key or passcode.

LOCKBOX/LOCKER - Equipped with a biometric lock, this secure storage option is lighter and smaller than a safe.






